

2015 ESID Summer School Report




The ESID Summer School took place in Calambrone, Pisa, Italy, from September 16 to 20, 2015. The event was very successful with 29 participants from all over the world and 10 faculty members attending 4 days of sessions sharing their knowledge and interest in PID and networking for their future career.

The field of PID is constantly evolving and it has become a challenge to include everything possible. However the new format mainly shaped on case discussion from students and insights on disease groups leaded by faculty, gave the opportunity to cover most of the topics as well as cutting-edge novelties in the field. The interaction was very intense with each participant presenting a case during one of the sessions inducing discussions and exchange.

Moreover, the social gathering over meals and occasional free time was the right frame to build up important connections among students in order to foster future collaborations. Encouraging the network within young people in the field is the best investment for the future!





New in 2015! For the first time in 2015, so called **"Master Classes"** have been introduced which focused on a special topic of interest which has been pre-determined by a survey send to the students. The following Master Classes where held during the Summer School:

- 1. Prevention and treatment of infectious diseases in PID. Vaccines, Immunoglobulin substitution and antimicrobial prophylaxis (Prof Andrew Cant)
- 2. Flow cytometry in PID. From basics to science (Dr Mirjam van der Burg)
- 3. Pathogens revealing PID (Prof Steve Holland)
- 4. Approach to syndromes with immune deficiency (Prof Kate Sullivan)
